






The Conservatory of Music

In Affiliation with The Toronto Conservatory of Music Director:

CYRIL S. MOSSOP, A.T.C.M., L.T.C.L.

During the year 1945-46 Mount Royal College Conservatory of Music has widened its sphere of influence and attracted students from all parts of Alberta, with some students coming even from points in British Columbia and The Conservatory has en-Saskatchewan. joyed a most successful season, due in large measure to the outstanding faculty of distinguished musicians and to the Director, Mr. Cyril Mossop. The enrollment of new students has been exceptionally large, which in itself speaks well for the high standard of training given at the Conservatory. In fact, Mount Royal College offers facilities for music students equal to those of the leading institutions of Eastern Canada and the United States.

Students are prepared for the examinations of the Toronto Conservatory of Music; the Associated Board of the Royal Academy and Royal College of London, England; and also for the Western Board music examinations, affiliated with the University of Alberta. Many students enter for both the local and Provincial Musical Festivals. During the recently held Calgary Musical Festival, many Mount Royal students gained high marks and commendation from the adjudicators, Dr. Charles Peaker of the Toronto Conservatory of Music, and Miss Ethel Kinley, music supervisor of the Winnipeg

schools.

The Mount Royal College Symphony Orchestra, under the able and expert direction of Clayton Hare, has achieved the standard of many professional orchestras. During the current season the enthusiastic members of this fine orchestra have attempted and successfully played exacting compositions such as Smetana's "On the Moldau" and Elgar's extremely difficult "Introduction and Allegro" for strings. It is hoped that, starting next year, season tickets will be offered for a series of four or perhaps five Symphony concerts during the season. Talented advanced students of the Conservatory are given the opportunity of appearing as soloists with

the orchestra at various concerts.

The Mount Royal College Junior Orchestra, also directed by Clayton Hare, has made great strides during the past season, both in regard to size and accomplishments. Besides giving afternoon concerts at no less than five of Calgary's public schools, they also gave two very successful public performances, and gained high praise at the Musical Festival. This orchestra, which rehearses once a week, affords a very valuable means of training younger students in orchestral technique and ensemble playing.

The immense value of ensemble playing cannot be overstressed; it contributes substantially to any student's practical musicianship, developing a keener eye, ear and general co-ordination.

Among the many attractive features of great benefit to the music student at the Conservatory. are the frequent concerts and recitals that are given during the year in the College Auditorium. Important works of the great masters, instrumental, vocal and ensemble are performed by students and professional musicians. These concerts and recitals are a real advantage to the student as he has the opportunity of hearing and becoming acquainted with many musical works, as well as the important experiences of performing himself. Students from all grades are permitted to perform at special Students' Recitals, and these are of inestimable benefit, giving an incentive to greater effort on the part of the student and also affording an opportunity of developing self-confidence, essential for a good performance.

All possible provision is made for students, especially those studying piano, to gain experience in ensemble playing. The periodic Students' Chamber Music Concerts feature Violin and Piano Sonatas, Piano duets, Trios and

String Quartettes.

The Faculty also give a number of Chamber Music Recitals which have become increasingly popular with the general public. During the past season five excellent and varied programmes were given at which two visiting artists were invited to assist. These Chamber Music Recitals make an important contribution to the musical life of Calgary and the public have attended in large numbers to hear the works of the lesser known composers as well as the masterpieces of the great.

Special Theory classes are conducted by Mr. Leonard Leacock, for which there is a small charge. Aural training classes are conducted by Mr. Cyril S. Mossop, for which there is no

charge to the student.




