Message To College

An enormously popular book back in the middle of the nineteenth century was one written by a shrewd Scotsman named Samuel Smiles, which he entitled "Self Help". It was one of the best sellers of the day in both Britain and the United States, and was translated into many languages. I imagine that it might become a best seller again to-day if some enterprising publisher decided to re-issue it in a modern format. In the preface, Mr. Smiles says that the object of the book was "to re-inculcate old fashioned but wholesome lessons — which cannot be too often urged — that youth must work in order to enjoy; that nothing creditable can be accomplished without application and diligence."

At the very start of the book he writes, "The spirit of self-help is the root of all genuine growth in the in-

dividual; and exhibited in the lives of many, it constitutes the true source of national vigor and strength. Help from without is often enfeebling in its effects, but help from within invariably invigorates. Whatever is done for men or classes, to a certain extent, takes away the stimulus and necessity of doing for themselves; and where men are subjected to over-guidance and over-government, the inevitable tendency is to render them comparatively helpless."

This is good advice for every day living and it is also sound educational philosophy. Students, who expect their teachers to do all their work for them, will never become efficient in their studies. The modern school provides for the student ample opportunities for self help and, consequently, for good progress in learning.

The most outstanding development at Mount Royal College during the past term has been the evidence of a development of this feeling of responsibility, and the desire of students to help themselves. Not only has this been evident in academic areas, but also the Student Councils have accepted their tasks with a maturity of outlook that is commendable. This attitude has been evident in the Reflector and now in the publishing of the Yearbook. The increase in the number of students in the library, the evident pride in the Student Lounge and increasingly mature attitudes in the Snack Bar, are all marks of the desire to assist. Thus, the task of administration has been made easier and restrictive regulations have been removed.

This is a vital and meaningful educational process of which we are all proud. It has been an inspiration to be associated with it this year, and I hope the spirit of the class of 1961 - 62 will continue to motivate our student body for years to come.

THE SADIE HAWKINS DAY DANCE












Girls' Basketball Team SPORTS




FOOTBALL


